6. "It moves and moves not". Explain this idea as found in the Vs. 5 of *Isavasyopanisad*.
7. Discuss the idea of the *Upanisad* which says, "What sorrow can be to him who has seen the identity?"
8. How does one cross death according to *Isavasyopanisad* ?
9. Bring about the teaching of *Isavasyopanisad* regarding immortality.
10. Elucidate the concept of *Purusa* according to the *Isavasyopanisad*.
11. Give a brief account of the Ethical teachings of *Isavasyopanisad*.
12. Discuss the state of a self-realized soul.
13. Bring out the difference between the "Manifest" and the "Unmanifest".
14. Discuss the significance of the prayer of dying man in *Isavasyopanisad*.
15. State the nature and value of devotion to God.
16. Discuss how action and inaction are reconciled in the *Isavasyopanisad*.
17. Discuss the nature of reality or manifest.
18. Bring out the nature and value of work according to the *Isavasyopanisad*.
